Americans With Disabilities Act 33rd Year Anniversary

July 26, 2023 marked the 33rd year anniversary of the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA). What is the ADA?

The ADA is a civil rights law. From voting to parking, the ADA protects people with disabilities in many areas of public life. The ADA is divided into five parts or "titles." Each title covers a different aspect of protection and accommodation for people with disabilities.

Title I. Employment

Employers must provide people with disabilities an equal opportunity to benefit from the employment-related opportunities available to others. This includes recruitment, hiring, promotions, training, pay and social activities.

Title II. State and Local Government

State and local governments must provide people with disabilities an equal opportunity to benefit from all of their programs, services and activities.

Title III. Public Accommodations

Businesses must provide people with disabilities an equal opportunity to access the goods or services that they offer.

Title IV. Telecommunications

Telephone companies must provide services to allow callers with hearing and speech disabilities to communicate.

Title V. Miscellaneous Provisions

The ADA also includes other requirements for how to implement the law. Examples of these requirements include:

- Prohibiting retaliation against a person who has asserted their rights under the ADA.
- Stating that a person with a disability is not required to accept an aid or accommodation if they do not want to.
- Authorizing courts to award attorneys' fees to the winning party in a lawsuit under the ADA.
- Directing certain federal agencies to issue guidance explaining the law.

New York Caring Majority Survey Seeking Input on Policy Priorities

A new online survey developed by the New York Caring Majority is looking to learn from home care recipients and their workers about the policies they think might best improve their lives.

The NY Caring Majority is a movement of older adults, disabled people, home care workers and family caregivers working to end the home care crisis in New York State. They have been working to increase the pay of home care workers as a way to end NY's home care worker shortage. Whether you are a home care recipient, a family caregiver (you support someone who receives home care, or provide it yourself), a nursing home resident, a home care worker or a case manager - they want to know: what changes to our home care system would change your life for the better? If you aren't currently impacted by the home care crisis, we want to know which policy initiatives you would be motivated to work on.

I was able to supervise the space for 20 hours throughout the 6 days of the fair and witnessed how appreciated it was. We had over 350 people visit, including officials from other County Fairs across the state to see how they could do the same for their fair. A parent sent the following text to one of the committee members saying, "My son loved it and it allowed us to be at the fair for 5 hours because he was able to take breaks. Without the space, we would have only lasted 2 hours. The Sensory Safe Space was amazing and a great idea all fairs should have!"


Office of the Aging BBQ Summer Splash
